### **Academic Advising**

### unlv.edu/advising

UNLV has 12 academic advising centers on campus, here to support students through their academic journey: Academic Success Center (advises exploring majors & pathways), Business, Education, Engineering, Fine Arts, Health Sciences, Honors, Hospitality, Liberal Arts, Sciences, Urban Affairs, and Pre-Professional Advising. Students are encouraged to schedule at least one academic advising appointment during the fall and spring semesters. Establishing a relationship with an academic advisor ensures that you meet your specific degree requirements and accomplish your personal academic goals.

### **Academic Success Center**

The Academic Success Center (ASC) is a resource hub that welcomes, guides, and supports students throughout their academic journeys. The ASC can help with exploring and choosing a major, and registering for classes, including a first-year seminar. They offer various services aimed at student success, including tutoring, academic success coaching, and a Math Bridge program to help students gain skills and confidence in college-level math.

### **University Libraries**

The University Libraries are a hub for student discovery, creativity, learning, and scholarship. As the main and largest library at UNLV, Lied Library is the campus's physical and intellectual center, with more than 2,500 study spaces, computer workstations, and group study rooms to support student learning. Four branch libraries provide access to specialized materials and offer research assistance and resources on architecture, medicine, music, and teacher development. Students also have access to the Makerspace and Multimedia Production Studios, multidisciplinary spaces dedicated to emerging technology where students can experiment and create.

### **Writing Center**

### The Intersection

Available to all students, The Intersection serves as an academic resource center for students seeking information and assistance on a variety of topics that reflect the challenges they encounter in their academic life. It is a multicultural center that focuses on demystifying the college experience for self-identified first-generation students and students of color.

### Center for Academic Enrichment & Outreach

The Center for Academic Enrichment & Outreach offers federally-funded programs that deliver services designed to motivate and support students from diverse backgrounds to pursue a college degree. They provide eligible students with various support services to help them achieve their educational goals, including tutoring, mentoring, academic and career counseling, and undergraduate research. All services are free to qualified students. Applications are accepted on a rolling basis, and space is limited.

### **Disability Resource Center**

### **RebelSAFE**

RebelSAFE provides real-time chats with police services dispatch, requests for Rebel Rides evening security escorts and shuttles, anonymous crime tip submission, and more. RebelSAFE Alert is the emergency notification system used for incidents that present an imminent threat to life, health, or safety. Alerts provide information and instructions to protect yourself during an emergency. Students are automatically enrolled in this system.

### **Rebel Rides Security Escorts**

### **Emergency Call Boxes**

RebelSAFE emergency phones are located throughout campus. They are illuminated by a blue light and equipped with a 360-degree surveillance camera. Request help, report a crime or suspicious activities, request a Rebel Rides shuttle, or other emergencies. Emergency calls from these phones will directly connect to University Police Dispatch or broadcast RebelSAFE Alerts via public address speakers.

### Female Self-Defense Classes



# Student Recreation & Wellness Center

The Student Recreation and Wellness Center (SRWC) is home to both Campus Recreational Services and the Student Health Center. Students registered for four or more credits are eligible to use the various services offered at the SRWC. Students registered for less than four credits may purchase an SRWC membership for \$25 per month.

Campus Recreational Services offers activity space for students to exercise, dance, swim or just relax, and the Bike Shop provides repairs services, workshops, and mountain bike rentals. At the Rec, students can also participate in various recreational sports. Intramural sports include basketball, outdoor soccer, flag football, and volleyball. And club sports include bowling, esports, ice hockey, and wrestling, just to name a few!

The Wellness Zone also provides a variety of inclusive safer-sex supplies, health education workshops and presentations, menstrual products, and other essentials at no cost to students.

The Student Health Center is a nationally accredited health center that provides comprehensive, essential medical and mental health services on an outpatient basis. There is no office visit charge, and same-day appointments are usually available. Appointments can be made by calling **702-895-3370**. Services available include:

- · Treatment of various illnesses and injuries
- Wellness exams and screenings for men and women, including complete physical exams and pap smears
- · Immunizations and vaccinations
  - Tetanus-diphtheria (Td); Measles, Mumps, & Rubella (MMR); Meningitis; Hepatitis; and more
  - Free flu vaccines
  - Free COVID-19 vaccinations and boosters
- · Immediate first aid and blood pressure checks
- Early detection and ongoing care of chronic illnesses
- Basic vision screening
- Smoking cessation assistance
- Sports medicine clinics
- Gynecology clinics
- Contraceptive evaluation and maintenance
- Pregnancy testing
- Health information and health education programs
- On-site licensed accredited clinical laboratory offering a variety of lab tests with a health care provider's order
- On-site licensed pharmacy offering standard prescription and nonprescription medications and supplies, including free thermometers and free at-home COVID-19 tests

Note: All medical records are confidential. Information will not be released to anyone without the student's written consent, except as required by law or in case of a life-threatening emergency. Students under the age of 18, by Nevada State Law, are minors and must have signed and notarized parental consent and release to obtain medical care. This must be on file at the Student Health Center prior to care being given, except in the case of an emergency. These forms are available upon request.

### **The Care Center**

### Counseling & Psychological Services

Pursuing a university education can be exciting, challenging, and sometimes highly stressful. Social and personal concerns can interfere with students' academic work and emotional well-being. Student Counseling and Psychological Services (CAPS) is committed to helping students benefit fully from their college experience at UNLV. CAPS is accredited by the International Accreditation of Counseling Services (IACS) and offers in-person and telehealth services. Our psychologists, counselors, behavioral health provider, and psychiatrist specialize in dealing with the problems commonly experienced by college students of all ages and backgrounds. We collaborate with students to increase self-understanding and develop the skills necessary to overcome personal concerns.

Confidential services offered to assist students in managing the adjustment demands and personal challenges of college include:

- Single sessions and brief consultations
- Individual, group, and couples counseling
- Crisis assessment and intervention
- Psychological assessment and testing
- Drug and alcohol use assessment and treatment
- Eating disorder assessment and treatment
- Medication evaluation and management
- Referrals to community health care providers when necessary

All currently enrolled UNLV students who have paid their Student Health and Mental Health Fees are eligible for confidential counseling services. Initial consultation appointments are available during office hours, Monday through Thursday from 8am–5pm and Fridays from 9am–5pm.

A crisis counselor is available during operating hours for situations that need immediate attention. After-hours phone crisis services are available by calling the CAPS main number **702-895-3627** and selecting the prompt to speak with a crisis counselor.



### Student Right to Privacy: FERPA

The Family Educational Rights and Privacy Act (FERPA) is a federal law that protects student records privacy and disclosure rights. In compliance with FERPA, UNLV does not disclose personally identifiable information in student education records except authorized by law. Parents and guardians requesting access to student academic and financial records may only do so after the student has permitted them through a third-party release.

### **Title IX Compliance**

Title IX is a federal law that prohibits discrimination based on sex in educational programs and activities that receive federal financial assistance. Examples of programs and activities that are subject to Title IX include admissions, recruitment, financial aid, academic programs, athletics, housing, and employment. Title IX also protects students from sexual harassment, which includes acts of sexual violence.

OFFICIAL NOTICE TO CAMPUS REGARDING SUBSTANCE USE. This official notice is issued pursuant to Subpart B, Section 86.100, of the Federal Drug-Free Schools and Communities Act Amendments of 1989.

### Dear Students:

Maintaining a campus community that fosters the highest standards of personal and institutional integrity is a critical component of university life. The University of Nevada, Las Vegas is committed to creating and maintaining a campus environment that is free of alcohol and substance abuse and views the abuse of alcohol and legal drugs and the use of illicit drugs as being antithetical to the pursuit of educational excellence and the realization of one's full potential as a student and member of this community.

Alongside the countless opportunities for community members' academic and personal success is the university's deep regard for their health and safety. UNLV recognizes that keeping our campus community safe and well necessitates the involvement of faculty and students alike to decrease the impact of alcohol and drug misuse and abuse. The UNLV Drug-Free Schools and Communities Act Notification describes the university's portfolio of alcohol and other drug programs encompassing policies, the Student Conduct Code, criminal regulations and penalties, the health risks associated with alcohol and drug use, and prevention, treatment, and recovery resources.
