

Success with the Legislature – Rules of Engagement

Elected Officials on Campus

We encourage units and campus leaders to cultivate and maintain strong rapport with the legislature and other elected officials. Our greatest assets are our students and talented faculty and staff - our elected officials should be more aware and more engaged with our campus community.

However, an integrated and well-coordinated approach toward engagement is both critical and necessary. The Office of Government and Community Engagement (GCE) should always be informed when elected officials are on campus, for any reason. The GCE team is poised to assist to ensure a successful campus visit.

Preparing for the Legislative Session

The agenda setting process for UNLV is inclusive, however, all agenda items must be vetted through the process outlined below. Going outside of the prescribed procedure should be discussed with President Whitfield as this impacts our overall strategy.

Agenda Setting Process:

- 1. Seek VP / Dean approval
- 2. VP / Dean to review with GCE
- 3. GCE to vet with UNLV Leadership Team led by President Whitfield
- 4. Ideas are then submitted to NSHE OR an appropriate legislator

Timeline:

• 2023

- o November 15: Submission deadline for ideas to GCE
- November December: Ideas are vetted through UNLV Leadership Team; and feedback provided to units

2024

- January Ideas / budget requests are submitted to NSHE
- January February: NSHE Campus Visits
- o March June: NSHE Board of Regents public vetting process
- July August: NSHE budget request and legislative agenda finalized
- o September: NSHE budget due Governors Finance Office
- o September December: Session preparation and outreach

2025

o Monday February 3rd: 120 Day - 83rd Legislative Session convenes
